Checklist: Essential First Steps in Spain for Foreigners

Essential Documentation and Registration

- [] Obtain the NIE (Foreigner Identification Number).
- [] Register at the town hall (Empadronamiento) in your locality of residence.
- [] EU/EEA/Swiss Citizens: Apply for the Union Citizen Registration Certificate (if your stay is > 3 months).
- [] Non-EU Citizens: Apply for the TIE (Foreigner Identity Card) once your visa/residence permit is granted.
- [] Verify the validity of your driver's license and whether you need to exchange it.

Finances and Banking

- [] Open a bank account in Spain (a non-resident or resident account, depending on your situation).
- [] Understand bank fees and options for international transfers.
- [] Learn about your initial tax obligations (IRNR for non-residents, IRPF if you become a resident).

Housing (Rental or Purchase)

- [] Look for accommodation: define the area, budget, and type of housing.
- [] If renting: understand the rental agreement, deposit (fianza), and duration.
- [] If buying:
 - o [] Perform due diligence (Nota Simple, property charges, legal status).
 - [] Understand the preliminary purchase agreement (contrato de arras).
 - [] Calculate purchase costs and taxes (ITP/VAT, AJD, notary, registry).
- [] Set up utilities (electricity, water, gas, internet).
- [] Get home insurance.

Healthcare

- [] Verify your right to public healthcare (Social Security, European Health Insurance Card, S1 form).
- [] If necessary, purchase private health insurance with comprehensive coverage.
- [] Register at your local health center (centro de salud) and get your individual health card (TSI) if you are eligible.

Integration and Daily Life

- [] Consider taking Spanish classes if you are not fluent.
- [] Familiarize yourself with local business hours and customs.
- [] Know the emergency numbers (112).
- [] Explore public transport options.
